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HS AFTER SCHOOL ENRICHMENT

Enrichment activities last one hour, unless otherwise noted. To enroll your child, please complete and return the attached sign-up sheet along with your payment. Feel free to return the sign-up sheet by mail, in person, or with your child. **The sign-up deadline is Tuesday, August 20, 2019. NOTE: Proper behavior is required for students to remain in the activities.**

HS ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES

MONDAYS

Art Club (September 9 through December 9)

Ms. Ammendola will help students develop their individual artistic talents and styles in this mixed media, mixed technique class. Students will learn how to draw using shapes. Emphasis will be placed on using a variety of drawing techniques, brush strokes, and everyday objects to attain different effects. Students are required to bring a large long sleeve shirt to use as a smock. (Minimum 3) (Maximum 5)

Cooking Club (September 9 through December 9)

Cooking Club members will learn rudimentary kitchen skills, which will include basic knife safety, proper kitchen sanitation, and common cooking styles (e.g., sautéing, broiling, and baking). Classes will consist of composing a simple recipe and working through the various stages of creating the dish. We may explore different ethnic styles and will produce various appetizers, entrees, and desserts. (Minimum 2) (Maximum 4)

TUESDAYS

Science Club (September 3 through December 10)

Students will explore the wonders of science in an activity-based club. They will cover a variety of topics through experiment and discussion. Specific subject matter will be based on student interest. (Minimum 3) (Maximum 6)

Film Club (September 3 through December 10)

In the Eaton Academy Film Club, students will learn to storyboard, draft, plan, film, and edit short movies. Additionally, students will practice basic special effects, both practical and digital. These will involve green screening, compositing shots, and basic stage makeup. When filming is complete, students will practice basic editing. Club members will not only make movies of our own but also analyze and evaluate films. Over the semester students will have a mix of “behind” and “in front of” the camera practice. (Minimum 3) (Maximum 6)

WEDNESDAYS

LOL Club: Improv Theater (September 4 through December 11)

Improv is about having fun, letting loose, and learning to laugh at ourselves while encouraging others. Participants will be exposed to basic improvisational skills in a positive and safe environment. They will learn to collaborate with others, shift perspectives, and gain confidence through repetition. (Minimum 4) (Maximum 6)

Bowling Club (September 4 through December 11)

Each week students will participate with their peers in two games of recreational bowling at Bowlero. Participants will be transported to the facility by Eaton staff, who will remain on-site to facilitate appropriate behavior and safety. Pick-up is at 4:00 pm at Bowlero. (Minimum 3)

Handyman Helper (September 4 through December 11)

Mr. Eaton will teach students to use basic hand and power tools to perform repairs that are often needed around the home. Students will tackle projects such as furniture and cabinet repair, hanging pictures, minor drywall, and plumbing. They will develop problem-solving skills to determine how to fix almost anything. The use of tools will be age and skill level appropriate. (Minimum 2) (Maximum 2)

THURSDAYS

Community and Leadership Club (September 5 through December 12)

This club offers a unique opportunity for students to learn how to develop their business skills while impacting the world around them. Our future leaders will learn about entrepreneurship, public speaking, civic involvement and community outreach opportunities with an engaging curriculum to channel their desire to have a positive impact on the community. (Minimum 5)

Mr. Simon’s Sports Club (September 5 through December 12)

Students will be able to engage in physical activity, building their cardiovascular health and overall endurance, while having fun. Mr. Simon will lead club members in a variety of sports, recreational activities, and exercise geared toward the interests of the group. Club activities will take place mostly on the sport court, but could include using facilities at area parks. This club is for all levels and abilities. (Minimum 4)

TO BE ASSIGNED --- Guitar Lessons

Music instructor Jake Cohan offers private guitar lessons for students of all levels. **Mr. Cohan’s lessons are 40 minutes long and can be scheduled according to the student’s availability.** Parents should indicate their interest on the enrichment form or contact Ms. Armstrong directly to work out the day and time for the lessons. Lessons are allotted on a first come, first served basis. Mr. Cohan will offer information about procuring instruments, books, *et cetera* for students when necessary.
