





K-8 AFTER SCHOOL ENRICHMENT

Enrichment activities last one hour, unless otherwise noted. To enroll your child, please complete and return the attached sign-up sheet along with your payment. Feel free to return the sign-up sheet by mail, in person, or with your child. The sign-up deadline is Tuesday, August 20, 2019. NOTE: Proper behavior is required for students to remain in the activities.

ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES

MONDAYS - THURSDAYS

Homework Hour (August 26 through December 12)

Homework Hour is available Monday through Thursday. The time will be monitored by our instructors. Students will have the opportunity to finish homework. Although Homework Hour is not a tutoring session, it is an academic period with instructors available for assistance. Students who finish homework early will be directed to read until the end of the period.

MONDAYS

Bowling (September 9 through December 9)

Each week students will participate with their peers in two games of recreational bowling at Bowlero. Participants will be transported to the facility by Eaton staff, who will remain on-site to facilitate appropriate behavior and safety. Pick-up is at 3:15 pm at Bowlero. Parents need to park, come inside, and initial the sign-out sheet. (Minimum 4)

TUESDAYS

<u>Art Club</u> (September 3 through December 10)

Ms. Ammendola will help students develop their individual artistic talents and styles in this mixed media, mixed technique class. Students will learn how to draw using shapes. Emphasis will be placed on using a variety of drawing techniques, brush strokes, and everyday objects to attain different effects. Students are required to bring a large long sleeve shirt to use as a smock. (Minimum 3) (Maximum 5)

<u>Handyman Helper</u> (September 3 through December 10)

Mr. Eaton will teach students to use basic hand and power tools to perform repairs that are often needed around the home. Students will tackle projects such as furniture and cabinet repair, hanging pictures, minor drywall, and plumbing. They will develop problem-solving skills to determine how to fix almost anything. The use of tools will be age and skill level appropriate. (Minimum 2) (Maximum 2)

Tennis Lessons (September 3 through December 10)

Bill Bean, a professional from Roswell Recreation and Parks, will teach tennis skills and strategies to students at Roswell Area Park on Woodstock Road. These sessions are appropriate for all levels, even the beginner. Students will be transported to the park by Eaton staff to work with Coach Bean and should be picked up at the tennis courts at 4:15 pm. (Minimum 4)

WEDNESDAYS

Whiz Kids Science Club (September 4 through December 11)

A teacher from Little Scholars will lead the club on a science discovery mission! Students will explore the world of chemistry, engineering, and earth science through experiments and encounters. This program will enhance STEM education philosophies with a big punch of fun. Join us for this exciting journey into the world of science! (Minimum 5) (Maximum 8)

ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES

Mindful Fitness (September 4 through December 11)

Students who need a little mindful exercise should run, run, run as fast as they can to this class full of fitness, fun and mindfulness! They will play games, have spirited team challenges, and participate in activities to create a mindful state. Participants will receive weekly mindfulness badges. This club is offered by Little Scholars. (Minimum 5)

THURSDAYS

Craft Masters Club (September 5 through December 12)

This D-I-Y class from Little Scholars is for *artsy-craftsy* kids who love to express themselves with one-of-a-kind masterpieces and crafts from around the world. Participants will discover their crafty side and sharpen their creativity as they design many mementos to be treasured. (Minimum 5)

Pokémon Go Club (September 5 through December 12)

Mr. Branson will use the free-to-play *Pokémon GO* app to enable students to indulge their fascination with the game. *Pokémon GO* encourages exercise, requiring users to walk to different places to catch Pokémon and gain points. The app keeps a record of the distance walked. The emphasis is on fun, exercise, and safety. This club will be a great opportunity for students to progress socially and creatively around a common interest. (Minimum 3) (Maximum 5)

LOL Club: Improv Theater (September 5 through December 12)

Improv is about having fun, letting loose, and learning to laugh at ourselves while encouraging others. Participants will be exposed to basic improvisational skills in a positive and safe environment. They will learn to collaborate with others, shift perspectives, and gain confidence through repetition. (Minimum 4) (Maximum 6)

TO BE ASSIGNED --- Guitar Lessons

Music instructor Jake Cohan offers private guitar lessons for students of all levels. Mr. Cohan's lessons are 40 minutes long and can be scheduled according to the student's availability. Parents should indicate their interest on the enrichment form or contact Ms. Armstrong directly to work out the day and time for the lessons. Lessons are allotted on a first come, first served basis. Mr. Cohan will offer information about procuring instruments, books, *et cetera* for students when necessary.
